Codorus State Park Management Updates

As another summer season nears its end, we all take a deep breath as we know our busiest season is ending.

As you all know we have struggled with staffing this season mainly in our Maintenance Department where we had a total of 9 vacancies. We have been in the process of hiring for these vacancies for most of the summer and we should be welcoming new staff members shortly. Hiring for manual labor positions has proven to be the most difficult compared to any other positions. We are fully staffed with DCNR Rangers and Education Staff. We have a few vacancies with Clerical positions which are in the process of being filled as well.

The Swimming Pool has also had its fair share of challenges this year. However, after extensive marketing and interviewing we were able to secure a total of 15 lifeguards and were able to operate the pool seven days a week with slides for the majority of the season.

The Black Rock Lodge will be opening for reservations by the 2nd week of September. These past few months proved to be quite difficult with limited staffing, however, we were able to make the final touches before opening which included landscaping, installing kitchen and laundry appliances, adding two fire ring areas. We also have a contract in place with Triple R Services to clean the house after each stay.

As you all have most likely seen, we had multiple areas freshly paved this summer. These areas include the Main Launch lower parking area, Swimming Pool parking areas, the ADA ramp at the Amphitheater, and both managers residence driveways.

The Pennsylvania Outdoor Corps (PAOC) has done a lot of much needed work around the park this season including spraying of invasive species, trail maintenance of the MaryAnn Furnace Trail, as well as a new boardwalk on the LaHo Trail. The PAOC will be back later in the year to finish projects on the LaHo Trail.

In spite of the many challenges presented to our staff this year, they all performed extremely well throughout the summer. Our Ranger Supervisor, Danica Bange and her staff attended to all law enforcement issues without a hitch. We did deal with a few major incidents; however, the team handled each one extremely well. The Education Staff, EES Renae Weidner and EIT Angela McCarty worked extremely hard providing wonderful education opportunities, even recording some of the highest attendance numbers for programs across the state. Our Maintenance Supervisor, Daniel Clark and his staff kept up with all maintenance responsibilities despite having more positions vacant than filled. Lastly, our Clerical Staff did an excellent job keeping up with the day to day tasks despite being short-staffed, as well as handling the multitude of complaints they received.

Throughout the summer we consistently had the 4th highest attendance total each month throughout all of Pennsylvania State Parks.

From all of us at Codorus State Park, we thank you for your support, dedication, and most of all, your time. We are grateful and thankful that we have such a wonderful group of volunteers. We are looking forward to another productive and safe year.

Pontoon Boat Renovation Project!

The Friends of Codorus State Park members Ellen, Jim, Gordy, Travis and Keith volunteered to take on finishing the upgrades to the parks pontoon boat used for tours of the lake that had been sidelined with COVID and the boat itself had deteriorated and needed some updates. With the maintenance shorthanded and pressure from region to get the boat back on the water the friends group stepped up to help. After 64 hours of work the group completed:



- Replacing decking plywood.
- Laid down new vinyl flooring
- Updated the seating from 12 to 17 people
- Painted the back of the boat
- Purchased additional seats
- Pressure washed the boat
- Fixed lights on boat trailer



The park hopes to get the boat back in service in September providing tours twice a week.

Winterfest 2023 Cancelled!

After trying different mechanisms/activities to increase interest to build up attendance and participation along with the current trend of less plungers each year it is with regret

that the Friends of Codorus State Park and Spring Grove Parks and Recreation Center will be cancelling the 2023 event as well as future events. While people attending enjoyed the event despite some rough winter weather the event was starting to lose revenue as well as relying on the same volunteers from past years, less sponsors and plungers it was becoming too much. We would like to thank all volunteers and sponsors that have given their time and effort in supporting this event in the past.



Invasives Species Removal

Invasive plants are species that cause harm to natural resources, economic activity, or humans. Removing them gives native vegetation a better chance to flourish. Unfortunately, invasive plants are very abundant throughout the park.

The Invasive Species Removal Team worked in the campground and at the Black Rock Lodge this past spring. In the campground, loop A, loop B, and most of Loop C were completed. We removed primarily



Autumn Olive, Bush Honeysuckle, and Multiflora Rose. Mike Bankert, Suzanne Gamber, Gary Harrity, and Frank Kozak helped to remove these invasives.



The work involved cutting small trees and shrubs with loppers, handsaws, and hedge trimmers, then applying an herbicide to the cut. As there are so many invasive plants in the park, culling them will be an ongoing effort for the foreseeable future.




