# **Experience Codorus Outdoors (ECO)**

The 2nd Annual Experience Codorus Outdoors (ECO) event will be held Friday, June 9th from 4 pm to 8 pm and Saturday, June 10th from 11 am to 8 pm. This event highlights the outdoor recreational opportunities offered at Codorus State Park, such as boating, fishing, kayaking, camping, birding, disc golf, and mountain biking.



Many new activities this year are targeted at families with children. The Kid's Zone will include puzzles, toss games, bubbles, water balloon volleyball, and more. For families with older kids, a treasure hunt with clues, a wildlife photo scavenger hunt, and an introduction to geocaching will be held.

The new Family Fun Area will allow families to fly kites, play badminton, cornhole, and croquet, and climb a rock wall! The water activities are guaranteed to get everyone wet.

Live local music, over 40 craft vendors, and food trucks will offer something for everyone. All these activities are included in the \$10 per car admission fee. The fee excludes vendor purchases.

# **Maple Sugaring Program**

The program started sooner than expected due to the warm weather. FOCSP volunteers collected over 427 gallons of sap and 164 bottles of maple syrup were sold as of mid-February. Due to the su success of the program, it will be expanded in 2024. A donation was made to allow for an additional purchase of a gas fired ½ pint evaporator that will be easier on our volunteers and reduce the amount of wood that is being burned.

Alice collected 366 bags of candy and trinkets for the kids. Don Eichelberger arranged for the volunteers and helped Ray Weleski and Bob Larsen set up the event.

# Park Manager's Update

The Summer season is in full swing. We have welcomed back all our seasonal employees and are as ready as we are going to be for the summer crowds! Although it is not summer yet, the park staff have been remarkably busy with preparations and projects.

Our Maintenance staff has been busy getting the park ready for the season. The pool area opened this weekend, splash pad only due to the hair and lint strainer for the main filter breaking while preparing the pool for the season. The replacement parts have been ordered. We are hoping to have the pool open by the 10th of June but that will be dependent on when the parts are received and installed, and provided the rest of the process goes smoothly. We also had a hydrant break in the C loop of the campground; the replacement part is ordered, but until it arrives, 10 full-hookup sites are without water.

The Rangers have had many incidents over the past few months, including multiple vehicle accidents, some of which resulted in vehicles entering the lake. Before the green-up this spring, the crew worked on maintaining park boundaries, signage, and overall law enforcement duties.

We welcomed a new EIT this season, Amber Fogelsanger, so Renae has been busy welcoming her. They have also been teaching school groups but are now in transition for the summer season including preparation for ECO and the Archeology camp! They have also been joined at times by our summer intern Taylor Cromer! If you see Amber or Taylor around, please give them a warm welcome!

Our clerical and administrative staff have been taking care of multiple items including the annual marina/sailboat/kayak rack slips, yearly agreements, pool season passes, preparing for our multiple park inspections this year, and preparing boundary letters.

Overall staffing update, as it stands, we only have four vacancies in the entire staff which are in the maintenance department as there are four open semi-skilled laborers (SSL). The job posting will be available from 5/30 until 6/13 if anyone knows someone looking for a job! In addition to the EIT and Intern, we welcomed three SSLs, one Laborer, one Clerical Assistant, and promoted two prior SSLs

to the positions of Maintenance Repairman 1 and 2. Also, it is expected that all 16 lifeguard positions and two lifeguard supervisors will be full this summer!

We would also like to thank the Friends of Codorus for all that you do. Over the past few months, the Maple Sugaring programs were held, the Easter Egg Hunt went well despite the dreary weather, the outpost was prepared for opening, and the ECO event preparations continued. We would not be able to do all that we do without the help of all of you, Thank you!

# **DCNR Award Speeches**

### Group Volunteer Award: Friends of Codorus State Park - Deanna Schall

The Friends of Codorus State Park is a dedicated group of local citizens that care about the park and the surrounding communities. They give countless hours of their time and efforts to ensure they are helping the park provide the much-needed natural space enjoyed by over 1 million visitors each year. They also provide stewardship opportunities throughout the year, ensuring the park is here for all to enjoy for generations to come.

Our Friends group holds over 10 events in the park throughout the year and participates in



events throughout the community, accumulating over 4000 volunteer hours annually. They hold two major annual events that are well attended by the community and raise thousands of dollars to be put back into the park. One of the largest and most expensive projects our Friends group has tackled is our Black Rock Lodge. Through their fundraising efforts and a \$60k grant from the Wareheim Foundation, the Friends were able to contribute over \$200K towards the Lodge rehab. With additional support from the park and Director's Office, the project was completed in 2022 and opened for reservations in September.
